OUR MISSION

To detect, prevent and raise awareness on kidney ailments and to provide quality, affordable treatment to underprivileged people.

- The TANKER (an acronym for Tamilnad KidneyResearch)Foundation is a registered, non profit charitable trust, founded on 30th June 1993.
- TANKER aims to provide health care and financial assistance to those who have kidney problems and do not have the wherewithal to seek medical attention.
- TANKER cares for the underprivileged, who suffer from kidney problems of any kind, regardless of caste, creed, sex or religion.
- TANKER, along with our goodwill ambassador Actor Suriya, intends to set up subsidised dialysis units in other parts of Tamil Nadu.
- TANKER, with Actor Suriya's help, aims to take awareness programmes to schools and colleges all over Tamil Nadu.





HOW TANKER WORKS

We have completed 16 years of service on June 30th 2009, contributing to the field of healthcare, research, training and advocacy with the purpose of helping underprivileged patients with kidney failure. As of March 2010, 67,007 dialyses have been given at subsidised rates for 598 patients, Rs. 56.35 lakhs has been disbursed to 930 patients through one-time contributions and 151 awareness programmes have been conducted.

Our first Dialysis Unit at Kilpauk (Chennai), started in the year 1999, has 11 Dialysis Machines. 550 dialysis were done per month out of which 160 were done free of cost. Our second Dialysis Unit at Ambattur Rotary Hospital (Chennai), started in 2006, has 5 machines. 253 dialyses were done per month, out of which 55 were free. Our third Dialysis Unit at TVS Hospital, Chokkikulam (Madurai), also started in 2006, has 7 machines. 280 dialyses were done per month, out of which 80 were free. In December of 2009, we opened our HIV Dialysis Unit with two machines dedicated to HIV patients having kidney failure. As of March 2010, we had 137 patients in the TANKER Fold.

The patients who seek our Dialysis Units are from impoverished backgrounds earning meager salaries. Some of them are auto rickshaw drivers, coolies, widows and those who have become unemployed due to this terrible disease. TANKER helps these underprivileged patients by giving them free or subsidised dialysis. Th WEBSITEe cost of dialysis per sitting in hospitals ranges from Rs. 800/- to Rs. 2500/-. Our cost is Rs. 800/- and we provide the dialysis at Rs. 400/- including the dialysier and tubings. The balance of Rs. 400/- is borne by us with the help of donations.

FINANCIAL CONTRIBUTIONS

The Foundation helps needy patients from all over India by offering them one-time contributions ranging from Rs. 1,500/- to Rs. 20,000/- towards fistula surgery, EPO injection, transplantation, investigation and post-transplantation medication costs. Upto March 2010 financial help has been given to the tune of Rs. 56.35 Lakhs helping 930 patients.through the donations we get.

HISTORY OF SOME PATIENTS HELPED BY TANKER

Dialysis

Mr Rajan is 46 years old, working as a security guard in a private company and earning



Rs 2,500 a month. His wife is a homemaker and he has two school-going children. He was diagnosed with kidney failure in 2009 due to high blood pressure. He was initially treated at the Government Hospital, but as they do not perform maintenance dialysis unless the patient has a related donor for transplantation, he had to be treated at a private hospital. As he could not meet the financial costs, he registered with TANKER and has been receiving subsidized dialysis since February 2010.



Fistula Surgery

Mr Thangarajan is 58 years old and developed kidney

failure in March 2010. He approached TANKER for financial assistance with his fistula surgery. A fistula needs to be done for a patient to have dialysis. This is where a vein and an artery are joined at the wrist to give proper access for dialysis. As he is unemployed, the foundation helped him with his fistula surgery cost. His son has offered to donate his kidney to Thangarajan, but the latter's health condition has rendered him unfit for a renal transplantation.

Transplantation

Mr Senthil Kumar is 35 years old and resides in Tirupur.



He works as a salesman at a textile

company and earns Rs 4,000 per month. He lives with his parents, who are retired. His kidneys failed and he started undergoing dialysis in June 2009. His mother came forward to donate her kidney to him. He had a renal transplantation at a private hospital in Coimbatore. TANKER partly funded his transplantation costs.

Dialysis

Mr Dexter is 36 years old. He works part-time at a charitable trust, making Rs 2,500 a



month. He was diagnosed with renal failure due to hypertension in January 1996. He was advised by doctors at a government hospital to undergo a kidney transplant. His mother volunteered to donate her kidney to him and he underwent a transplantation in September 1996. Post transplantion, all patients are required to take anti-rejection medication. However, Dexter could not afford these medicines and two years later, he was diagnosed with renal failure again and was back on dialysis. He has been undergoing subsidized dialysis at TANKER since October 2001. He is hoping for a cadaver transplantation in the future.

Invtestigation



Mrs Alamelu is 35 years old and the wife of a farmer, who earns about Rs 2000 per month. They have a young son. She was

diagnosed with kidney failure in 2009. She was first treated at a government hospital and was then shifted to a private hospital in Chennai. Her husband can barely afford her dialysis expenses. As she does not have a related donor for transplantation, she has registered with the government hospital and awaits a cadaver transplant. Her doctor advised her to take an HCV RNA test, that determines the prevalence of Hepatitis C. TANKER paid for the test and the investigation costs.

TANKER holds one main fund raising event annually, which is the Republic Eve TANKER Charity Nite. This event has taken place every year from the year of inception. Many local celebrities who support our cause attend this event and donations are made directly. One of the highlights of the programme is the music or dance programme that is usually performed by a survivor of kidney disease or any other major ailment.

This year we had a special music performance by the band from Nethrodaya, a self-help institution for the visually and physically challenged.

Awareness Programmes

NETWORKING

The Foundation regularly organizes talks in schools for creating awareness about kidney diseases and the symptoms to look out for, their prevention and early treatment. Upto March 2010, 151 such programmes have been conducted by Mrs. Rajalakshmi Ravi, Dr. Suresh and Dr. Georgi Abraham.









Screening Camps

The Foundation regularly organizes screening camps in schools and communities for early detection and diagnosis of kidney related problems. Such camps highlight the need for timely treatment of kidney ailments. Upto March 2010, 16 such programmes have been done by Mrs. Rajalakshmi Ravi, Dr. Suresh and Dr. Georgi Abraham.

Internship and Training

TANKER Foundation also offers internships to students from colleges doing under graduate and post graduate courses which enable them to learn about the functioning of an NGO by participating in all the NGO's activities. Our interns have been a part of our awareness programmes, administrative work, fund-raising projects and counseling. The Foundation is a training ground for nurses and lab technicians.

Issues and Challenges

Setting up of TANKER Subsidized Dialysis Unit in Coimbatore to give subsidized and free dialysis for needy kidney failure patients in and around Coimbatore. We intend to expand our services by setting up several units in and around Chennai.

Other Developments

We hope to open Subsidized Dialysis Units in Trichy, Thirunelveli and other areas of Tamil Nadu. TANKER Foundation is able to offer subsidized dialysis at a very low cost mainly because the space where the unit is situated is donated to us on an MOU with no rental costs. Our three units so far and our administrative office are in rent free premises.

In Coimbatore Shri. Krishna Kumar of Arya Vaidya Pharmacy (Coimbatore) Ltd. has come forward generously and given us space in the heart of Coimbatore with easy access for patients and also hospitals nearby.


Joy of Giving Week
