Our Vision:

No patient should be denied of treatment due to financial constraints and everyone has the right to good health and treatment

Our Mission:

To detect, prevent and raise awareness on kidney ailments and to provide quality, affordable treatment to underprivileged people.

TANKER (an acronym for Tamilnad Kidney Research) Foundation is a non-profit registered trust, founded on 30th June 1993 by Dr Georgi Abraham Prof of Medicine and Consultant Nephrologist and like minded people to reach out to underprivileged patients with kidney disease.

TANKER aims to provide health care and financial assistance to those who have kidney problems and do not have the wherewithal to seek medical attention.

TANKER cares for, the underprivileged, who suffer kidney problems of any kind, regardless of caste, creed, sex or religion.

TANKER along with our goodwill ambassador actor Suriya intends to set up subsidized dialysis units in other parts of Tamil Nadu.

TANKER with Actor Suriya's help aims to take kidney disease awareness programmes to schools and colleges all over Tamil Nadu.

How TANKER Works:

We have completed **17** years of service on **June 30th 2010**, contributing to the field of healthcare, research, training and advocacy with the purpose of helping underprivileged patients with kidney failure. Upto **March 2011, 82,418 dialysis** have been given at subsidized rates for **659 patients** and **Rs. 66,30,706** has been disbursed to **1179 patients** as one-time contributions ranging from Rs. 5,000/- to Rs. 50,000/- for dialysis, transplantation and medication costs. We have conducted over **174 Awareness Programmes**.

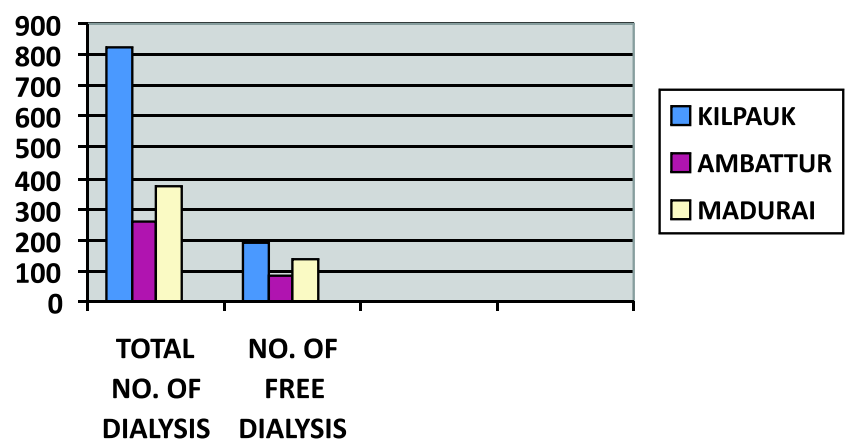
Our first Dialysis Unit at Kilpauk (Chennai) started in the year 1999 has 12 Dialysis Machines. 820

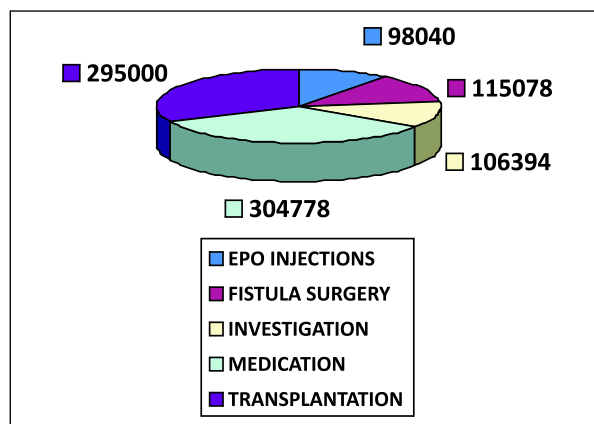
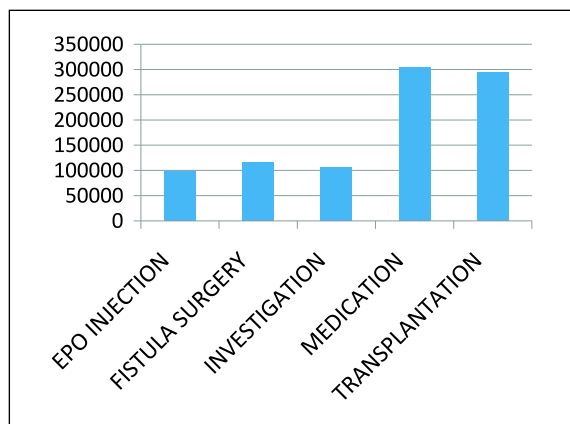
dialysis per month are done of which 190 are given free. Our second Dialysis Unit at Ambattur Rotary Hospital (Chennai) started in 2006 has 6 machines. Here 258 dialysis are done, of which 84 are given free. Our third Dialysis Unit at TVS Hospital, Chokkikulam (Madurai), also started in 2006 has 9 Dialysis machines. We do around 373 dialysis per month out of which 138 are free. In December 2009 we opened our HIV Dialysis Unit with 2 Machines dedicated to HIV patients having kidney failure. As of March 2011 we have 149 patients in the TANKER Fold. We also have dialysis facilities in PIMS Pondicherry and in GB Pant Hospital, Port Blair.

The patients who have dialysis in our Units are from impoverished backgrounds earning meager salaries. Some of them are auto rickshaw drivers, coolies, widows and those who have become unemployed due to this terrible disease. TANKER helps these underprivileged patients by giving them free or subsidized dialysis. The cost of dialysis per sitting in private hospitals range from Rs. 1000/- to Rs. 2,500/-.



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Our cost is Rs. 800/- and we provide the dialysis at Rs. 375/- including the dialyser and tubings. The balance of Rs. 425/- is borne by us through donations from wellwishers.

Financial

Contributions:

History of some patients helped by TANKER:

Dialysis:

Mrs. P.S. Bhuvaneshwari, aged 41 years resides in Chennai with her parents. She is a divorcee and has no children.



Her father is a retired railway employee and gets a pension. She has a brother who is married and

settled. Both of them support her for her dialysis. In 2000, she had an accident and broke her legs. She was treated in a private hospital and was under medication. In 2004 she became very serious; she was taken to a private hospital again and was diagnosed with renal failure. She was on dialysis for two years. The

cost per dialysis in private hospitals ranges from Rs. 1,000/- to Rs. 2,500/- plus consumables. As she was not able to afford her dialysis expenses, she was referred to TANKER Foundation and joined us on 15th March 2006. She does not have a related donor and is not interested in registering for Cadaver Transplant due to her disability. Her health has improved greatly after taking regular dialysis at TANKER's Ambattur Unit.

Fistula Surgery:

Ms. E. Dhaphni, who is 17 years old, resides in Perambur, Chennai. Her father works as an auto driver and earns Rs.3000/- per month. her



mother is a home maker, her elder sister is going for typewriting class and her brother is married and settled.

She was affected with renal failure in August 2010 and was admitted in Government Hospital, Chennai where she was advised for transplantation. As she did not have a donor she was refused for dialysis in a Government Hospital

and she joined TANKER where she underwent a fistula surgery and is undergoing Dialysis at present.

Transplantation:

Mrs. R. Pandi Meena aged 26, resides in Mandaveli Chennai. She was married but her husband deserted her as she was suffering from kidney ailment in the year 2008. Her mother is a



home maker, her brother works as a van driver and earns Rs.5000/- per month. She underwent transplantation on 14.07.2010 in a private hospital and the donor being her father. She was unable to purchase post transplant medicines and had approached TANKER for



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financial assistance and is thankful to TANKER for its support.

Medication:

Ms. K. Muthuselvi, who is 28 years old, resides in Porur, Chennai. In 2010, she was diagnosed with renal failure due to uncontrolled high blood pressure and was advised for transplant. She underwent cadaver transplantation in a private hospital in December 2010. Her father is a transplant patient and mother is a home maker. All



transplant patients are required to take anti – rejection medication for the rest of their lives. The monthly expenses for her medicines is nearly Rs. 10,000/-. As she could not afford to meet her medical expenses, she approached TANKER for financial assistance for medication, which we were fortunately able to provide thanks to our generous donors.

Investigation:

Ms. Thenmozhi is aged 31 years and has been separated from her husband, due to her kidney failure. She is staying with her parents in Tharamani, Chennai. Her mother works as a sweeper in

a ration shop and earns Rs. 4000/- per month. Her elder brother is working in a Xerox Centre earning Rs. 2500/- per month and younger brother is school going. In 2009, she was diagnosed with kidney failure and advised for transplant. She underwent transplant in March 2011 at KMC hospital, Chennai. Her mother was the donor. She approached us for financial assistance for Tacrolimus Level test, which was done with help from TANKER donors.



Fund Raising:

TANKER holds one main fund raising event annually, which is the **Republic Eve TANKER Charity Nite**. This event has taken place every year from the year of inception. Many local celebrities who support our cause attend this event and donations are made directly. One of the highlights of the programme is the music or dance programme that is usually performed by a survivor of kidney disease or any other major ailment

This year's programme was performed by RASA. Ramana Sunritya Aalaya. RASA, founded in 1989 by Dr. Ambika Kameshwar is a unique organisation which focuses on the holistic development of children and people with disabilities through the tools of theatre like music, dance, drama, story telling, arts and crafts.

They performed "THE FOUR Es "Exploration, Experience, Expression, Enjoyment" which is a professional theatre group, where all the performing artists were Special and trained at RASA.



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The Krishnan-Ang Endowment Lecture:

This year the Krishnan-Ang Endowment Lecture was delivered by Dr. Brian Pereira, a world renowned Nephrologist from Boston on “Solving the challenges of kidney disease – the journey of one Indian Nephrologist” for our 18th Annual Charity and Awards Nite held on 20th January 2011 at Hotel Savera.

Research & Service Awards Given Annually:

TANKER presents research and service awards every year during the time of Republic Eve TANKER Charity Nite, in order to honour the doctors for their services to the people.

The “Muthoot M. George Memorial TANKER Foundation and Kerala Kidney Research Foundation Research Award” was awarded to Dr. Arpana Iyengar, Associate Professor, Division of Pediatric Nephrology, St John's Medical College Hospital, Bangalore for her research into “Biomarkers for renal osteodystrophy in Indian children with chronic kidney disease” for encouraging her to do

more research work into kidney diseases in children. The Award carried a Rs. 2 lakhs cheque, citation and gold medallion.

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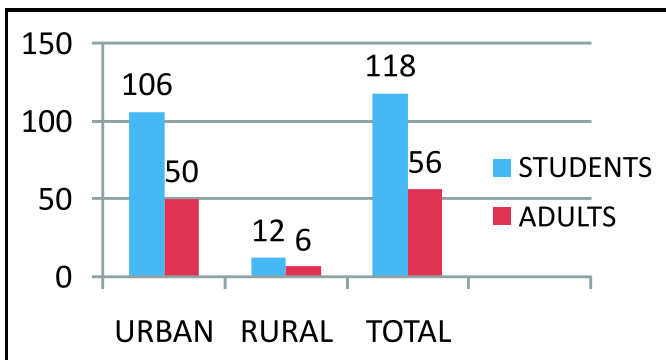
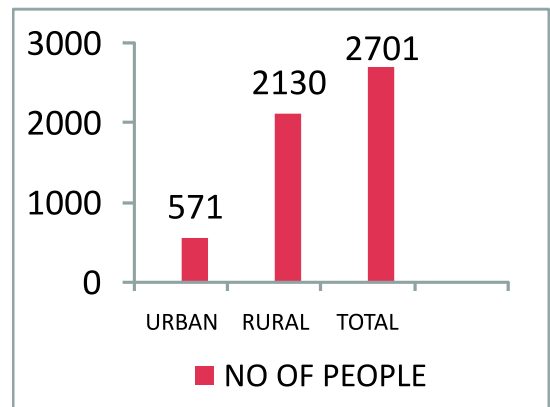
Spreading Awareness and Networking:

Brief description about the patient:



Mrs. Sampoornam, 56 years of age, is a widow residing in Ambattur Chennai. She completed her PUC through a correspondence course. She has a son who is college

going. She married her relation Mr. M.N. Malaikkaruppan, who unfortunately passed away in 2007 also due to kidney failure. He worked as an Agricultural Officer for the Tamil Nadu Government. Mrs. Sampoornam, receives a pension of Rs. 10,000/- per month out of which she manages her dialysis expenses and her son's studies.

She was diagnosed with polycystic renal disease at the time of her pregnancy in the year 1988. Renal failure was a hereditary problem in her family. She was treated in a private hospital at Chennai and was under medication for seven years and subsequently advised for dialysis. The cost per dialysis in private hospitals ranges from Rs. 1,000/- to Rs. 2,500/- plus consumables. As she was not able to meet her expenses she was referred to TANKER and joined

our Subsidized Dialysis Unit on the 27th September 2007. She cannot go for kidney transplantation

as she is suffering with polycystic renal failure and should be on dialysis throughout her life. Her health has vastly improved after taking regular dialysis. She is thankful to TANKER donors for helping her with her dialysis costs.

Brief description about the patient:



Mrs. Lilly George, 49 years of age, is a widow residing in Thirumangalam, Chennai. Her husband, who was a diabetic patient and worked as a clerk in English Electric Company, passed away in 1996. She has three daughters. Two of her daughters, Mrs. Joli Devakerubai & Mrs. Buela are married housewives, her third daughter, Ms. Jean, who completed her M.A. in Human Resources, works in a Call Centre at Velachery and earns around Rs. 13,000/- per month. Her's is the only source of income in her family and she takes care of her mother's dialysis expenses.

Mrs. Lilly George started showing symptoms of renal failure when she started vomiting severely, with loss of appetite, and drastic weight loss. She consulted a Doctor in a private hospital in Chennai and was diagnosed with renal failure in the 2006. The cost per dialysis in private hospitals ranges from Rs. 1,000/- to Rs. 2,500/- plus consumables. As she was not able to meet her expenses she was referred to TANKER and joined our Subsidized Dialysis Unit on the 21st of January 2007. She does not have a donor and is not interested in registering for a Cadaver Transplant. Her health has improved greatly after taking regular dialysis. She is thankful to TANKER donors for helping her with her dialysis costs.
